Each month, our Innovative Ideas section explores organizations and people who are enhancing and improving digital access in our region and beyond. In this issue, we introduce you to EveryoneOn, a nonprofit helping asset-limited families connect to affordable internet service, obtain low-cost computers, and receive digital skills training through free online resources, like their [Offer Locator Tool](#). The tool allows users to enter their zip code and select criteria, like whether they live in public housing or have a K-12 or college student in their household. They are then directed to discounts on services, devices, and training tailored to their financial needs. Through accessible resources and services, like their Offer Locator Tool, EveryoneOn has helped nearly 800,00 people bridge the digital divide since its founding in 2012.
